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Feedback Analysis

The Feedback Analysis Committee of the college designs and collects feedback from its stakeholders to monitor and evaluate its performance quality on curriculum and curriculum related issues. The feedback forms were collected from students on several aspects of curriculum and its learning related issues in terms of quality, competence, skills and professionalism. This feedback also considers other issues like delivery of curriculum by teachers. The report of feedback analysis is submitted to the Co-ordinator of IQAC for necessary action.

Students Feedback Analysis Report 2021-22

Out of total 50 responses, 65% students are satisfied with the course objectives. 66% believes that the overall environment in the class conductive to learning is very good. Regarding the learning resource in the college library, it is seen that only 38% student gives their view as very good. Regarding teachers' responsiveness to student's need and problem 54% student gives their view as excellent.

Teacher's Feedback Analysis Report 2021-22

Out of total 17 respondents, majority are of the opinion that the course objectives and outcomes of the course are well defined and clear to faculties and students. Regarding Library infrastructure almost all the teachers give their view to improve it. All of them also view to improve the overall infrastructure of the college. Majority of the teachers are satisfied about the examination system conducted by the parent university.

Employer's Feedback Analysis Report 2021-22

Most of the employers are satisfied about the overall quality, and personality of the employees.

Alumni Feedback Analysis Report 2021-22

Out of total 50 responses, only 36% went for further studies. Regarding relevant of the curriculum with higher studies, 56% are in support of that. Majority of alumni i.e., 54% are engaged in private profession. Majority of the alumni i.e., 62% are of the view that they are satisfied with the relevance of the curriculum with respect to current job opportunity.

Parents' Feedback Analysis Report 2021-22

Out of total 50 responses, 76% are satisfied with the development of personality of their wards. Regarding academic of the college, majority want improvement of it. Regarding encouragement to students for participation in various co-curricular activities, only 38% are satisfied. Regarding infrastructural facility of the college, almost all the parents viewed that it should be developed.
